Cups were also presented to those pupils who have both excelled in their respective sports and have also proven to be helpful and encouraging to their classmates. Our new additions to Sports Day such as activities which focused on teamwork and throwing events were very well received and brought a different perspective to the day. The Open Day aspect also added to the occasion.

On 5th June, as part of our build up to Sports' Day, children took part in STEM activities, working in teams (from 6th Class to Junior Infants) to make posters and to construct a structure/wrapping for an egg to protect it falling from a height. The children all enjoyed working together and were excited to see the results of the egg drop! These activities highlighted teamwork, positive attitude and inclusiveness, three vital elements that we strive for in Rathmichael, while earning points for their teams. 3rd to 6th Class also took part in a long distance race on 10th June and team points were also awarded.

Hockey Matches were held between Parents and 6th Class pupils on 20th June which was enjoyed by all. Thankfully there were no injuries. 6th Class pupils ran out the winners.

Football Team – huge congratulations to our Football Team who won their Inter Primary League. They were presented with a Cup and their medals after Assembly today.

Pupils' Achievements

The Community Games provincial finals took place in Santry recently and one of our pupils, Ella, was part of the winning 100 metre Under 13 mixed relay team who competed for Shankill. This gold medal win secures their place in the national competition in Carlow in August.

Well done to Tom and Nathan C from 3rd Class who were on the winning team in the Cabinteely World Cup tournament finals, held recently.

A number of pupils took part in Park Runs recently – hopefully this will continue over the Summer months.

Workshops/Classes/Tours

There have been a huge variety of Summer School Tours taking place this month. 6th Class went to Carlingford for two days, 4th and 5th Classes went to Clara Lara, 3rd Class want to Dublinia and Viking Splash, 1st and 2nd Classes visited the Butlers Chocolate Warehouse and Croke Park while the two Infant classes travelled to Glenroe Farm. I am very grateful to staff and parents who accompanied them on these tours.

On 10th June, half of 1st and 3rd Classes went on a Buddy Class visit to Shankill Library to learn all about what the library has to offer. They shared a book together and then enjoyed a story, read by the Librarian. The other half of the classes went on 12th June. Thanks to the Library staff for facilitating the visit and to the staff and parents who accompanied them.

On 17th June, 6th Class went to visit Leinster House and Dail Eireann, having been invited by Minister Jennifer Carroll MacNeill, TD. My thanks to Shirley Farrell for providing facilities for them to eat lunch after the trip.

4th Class were visited by representatives of CIH (Children in Hospital), who spoke to them about the work of the independent charity. The class helped put activity packs together which will be distributed to children in hospital to help create a more positive experience for them at a difficult time in their lives.

Two representatives from the RNLI visited 5th and 6th Classes to give water safety talks. They impressed upon the children the need to be cautious around water and also what to do in the event of an incident involving themselves and their friends. This is particularly relevant as we approach the Summer holidays.

We had very successful African Drumming workshops for all the classes on 14th June where the children learnt about rhythm and the basics of drumming. They really enjoyed themselves and joined in with great energy and enthusiasm.

We welcomed our incoming Junior Infants and their parents on 7th June for a children's Teddy Bears' Picnic and parents' information session. The children were very excited to meet their teacher and visit their classroom.
